## "Lazy Daisy" stitch

Lazy Daisy stitches are perfect to imitate flowers and petals.

1. Bring the needle up through the fabric at your starting point (point A).
2. Insert the needle again at the starting point (point A) and pull the thread through so there is a small loop of thread on the surface.
3. Bring the needle up a short distance from the starting point (point B), catching the loop of the thread as you pull it through (photo 4).
4. Insert the needle back into the fabric on the opposite side of the loop of thread (photo 5), tacking it in place. Here is a ready small leaf stitch.

Repeat the process to make other stitches according to the chart.



## Spider Web Stitch

A spider web stitch is an isolated embroidery stitch that creates a round shape.

1. Start with a group of straight stitches radiating from the center (photo 1). The number of straight stitches may vary, depending on the size and look you desire.
2. Bring the needle up near the center and slide it under the nearest spoke from right to left (photo 2).
3. Slide the needle under the same spoke as well as the next spoke to the left. This will create a wrap on the first spoke and have the needle in place as you repeat this process (photos 3-5).
4. Continue wrapping each spoke, working around the web and filling it in. Take care that you don't pull the wrapping too tightly (photo 6).
